Awards Ceremonies

One of the most enduring and unique symbols of the Arctic Winter Games is the ulu medal, modeled on the all-purpose knife traditionally used by Inuit people. At each Arctic Winter Games, ulus are awarded in gold, silver and bronze to recognize first, second and third-place winners in sporting competitions. Coaches and cultural

delegates also receive distinctive ulus for their commitments to excellence.

Once you've consulted the Ulu News Daily or AWG website to see who's won the ulus, you'll probably want to be there to witness the pomp and pageantry that accompanies the presentation.

Ulu awards presentations will occur at 4:30 p.m. each day at Lotteries Place beside the Elijah Smith Building on Main Street. The remaining awards presentations occur at sport venues.












Overview Schedule of **Sporting Events**









AWGie's Family Festival






