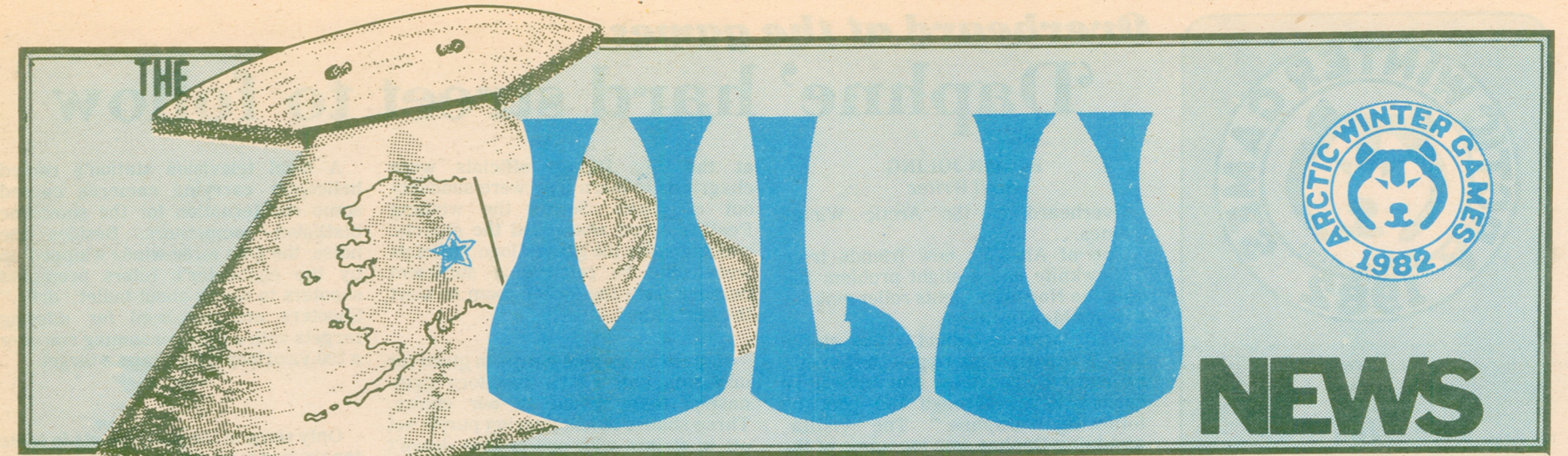

Overheard at the games 'Daphne' hard street to follow

One of Alaska's new friends from Yellowknife had a slight problem finding the Northern Lights roller rink for a dance Monday night.

While stopped behind a bus at the Fort Wainwright guard post, he thought he heard the guard tell him it would be easiest to go through the post by following "Daphne." 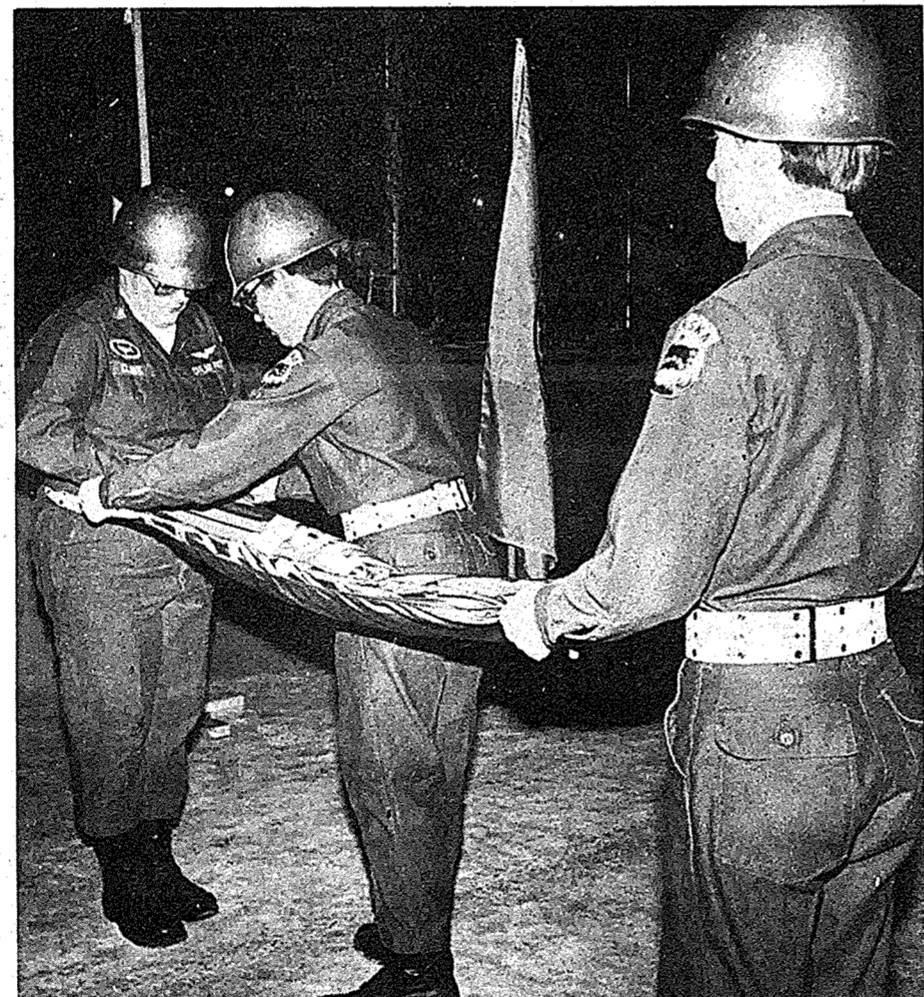

A local television station's rented helicopter carrying cameras caused some consternation for the snowshoe biathlon competitors. Besides the noise, the gale force winds whipped up by the eggbeater's rotors prompted shooters to worry about "drift." Shooters are penalized for missing targets with a time consuming run over a 200-yard loop if they miss a target.

Only some of the participants in table tennis were unable to attend Friday night's closing ceremonies. At the end of regular round robin play, three pairs were tied in both the junior men's doubles and the junior mixed doubles, prompting the need for a playoff. Confounding the problems was that several of the players were tied in both matches. As closing ceremonies got underway at Alaskaland at 7 p.m. Friday, matches at Hunter Elementary School were still going on.

Ann Thomas and her daughter Holly were given the task of testing the 1,000 Bic Flicks passed out to competitors for the closing ceremonies. As athletes lined up for the parade into the staging area, the Thomases enlisted several others standing by to flick the Bics and make sure they worked.

Five days of competition end

Games rich in medals, memories

Alaska's team took home the most total medals, Yukon's Rick Barnett took home the most individual medals and everyone took home a week's worth of memories as the seventh biennial Arctic Winter Games ended Friday for over 1,000 northern athletes and coaches.

The Yukon Territory, which won the Stuart M. Hodgson Trophy for team sportsmanship, gave the Alaskans a run for their money in the overall medals standings. But Alaska still came out on top with 61 gold ulus and 149 total medals. Yukon athletes picked up 38 golds and 119 total medals while the Northwest Territories won 19 golds and 81 total medals.

Barnett, a snowshoer, was the week's big individual winner taking home five

gold ulus and one bronze ulu. Yukon teammate Pauline Craig, also a snowshoer, matched Barnett's total of five gold ulus but came up one shy of him in total individual medals won.

Overall, it was a week of record-setting performances in arctic sports, Northwest domination in curling, Yukon domination in snowshoeing and hockey, and Alaska domination in basketball, cross country skiing, figure skating, shooting and volleyball.

Following is brief review on each of the 15 Arctic Winter Games sports competitions during the weeklong

games hosted by the Fairbanks Host Society.

Arctic Sports Northwest's Tim Angotingoak and Alaska's Lady Laroux set world records in the two-foot high kick (7-foot-9) and women's one-foot high kick (6-9), respectively. Also Arctic Winter Games records were bettered in four events during the three-day competition which drew some of the largest crowds of games.

Northwest's Allen Anavilok was the only double gold uluist in arctic sports as he captured the men's knee jump and rope gymnastics competitions while setting games records in both events. Alaska's Ike Towarak set a games record while winning the men's one-foot high kick and Northwest's Tony Kiegenberg set a games record while winning the one-hand reach.

Other gold uluists were Northwest's Jerry Cockney in the airplane event and Yukon's Jucelyn McIntyre in the women's knee jump.

Badminton Yukon players captured six of the 10 badminton titles, while the Northwest

won three and Alaska won one. Each of the champions qualified for the finals and semifinals by leading their respective divisions in round-robin play.

Taking titles for the Yukon were Kathy Casselman in junior women's singles, Roland Cormier in junior men's singles, Julia Olsen and Casselman in junior women's doubles, and Cormier and Darrell Peters in junior men's doubles, Olsen and Peters in junior mixed doubles and Kristy Carter in open women's singles.

Northwest players winning their divisions were Laurell Lovell and Wendy Foreman in open women's doubles, Chick Callas and Rod Stirling in open men's doubles, and Foreman and Stirling in open mixed doubles. Alaska got its only badminton gold from Stoy Neyhart in open men's singles.

Basketball Yukon's open men's team handed Alaska a rare defeat in basketball, but the Alaskans bounced back to avenge the loss in the championship finals and

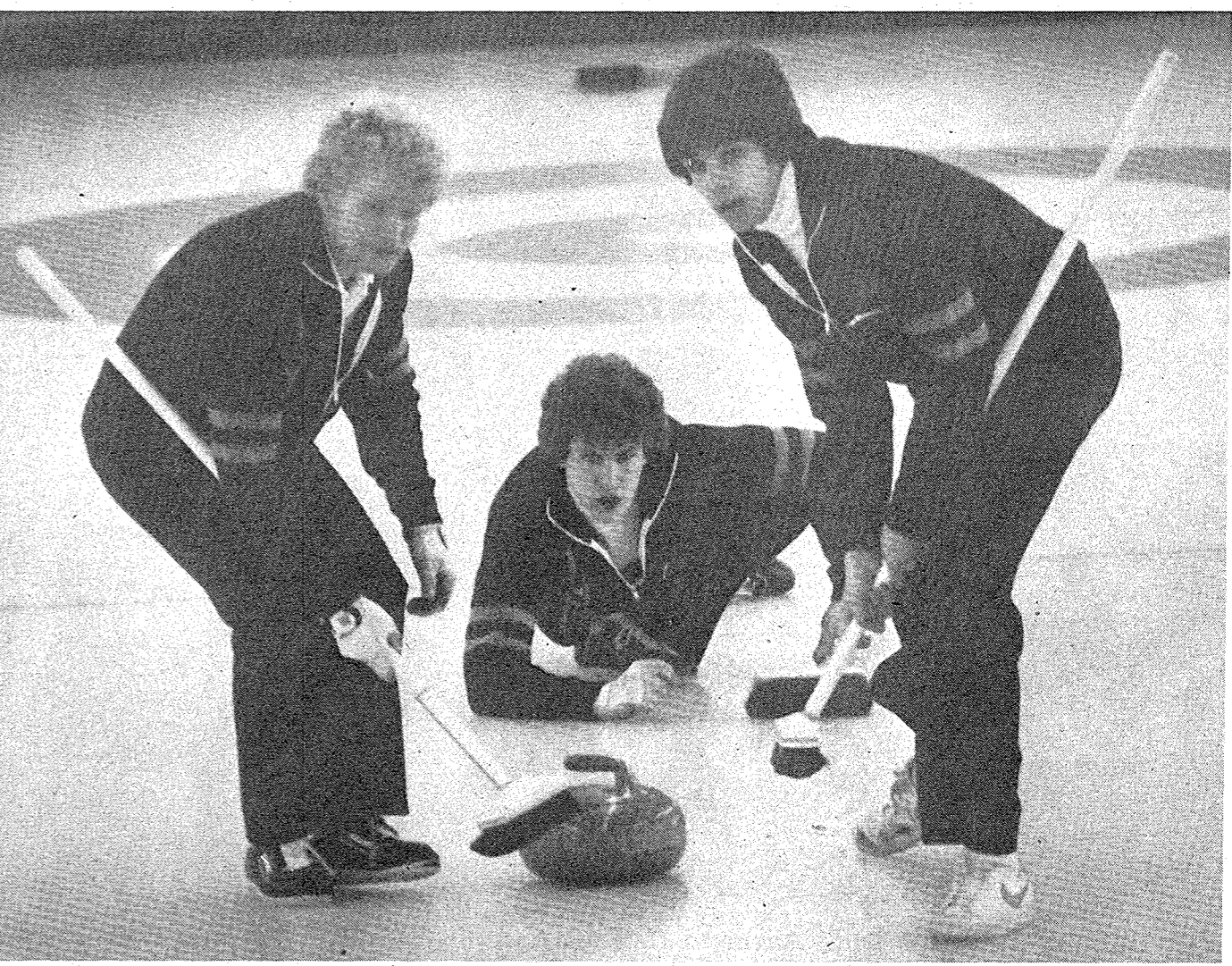
