Extreme cold interferes with Games schedule

An extreme cold warning affected outdoor sports on Wednesday. As the temperatures dropped to -35C with the windchill, biathlon and cross-country skiing were cancelled for the day. Snowboarding was postponed in the afternoon in hopes of it warming up.

The sport also had events switch days. Instead of the snowboard cross, organizers went ahead with banked slalom, so fewer participants were outside at a time.

Alpine skiing and snowshoeing originally went ahead as planned with extra safety precautions in place. By afternoon, the 800m and 1500m snowshoeing events were postponed. Anthony Sanders of Team Nunavik Quebec and winner of the bronze ulu after competing in the 400m and 100m snowshoeing events said, "It was pretty cold, but our preparations remained the same."

Snowshoeing medals will now be awarded on Friday for the events that went ahead as planned as well as the rescheduled events which have been postponed due to extreme cold.

An Extreme Cold Warning statement from Environment Canada was issued on Thursday issued and remains in effect due to the increased risk of frostbite and hypothermia in these temperatures.

The U16 male hockey tournament continued Wednesday with two undefeated teams going head-to-head. Northwest Territories and Nunavut, both 3-0, battled in the game dubbed, "The Fight of the Northern Wolverines." In an evenly matched game, it was a hard-fought battle between the two teams where scores were deadlocked at 3-3 after two periods of play. At the start of the third period, the stands were completely packed, and the standing room was tight in some spaces. Team Northwest Territories started to take control of the game in the third period and ran the score up to 6-3, but the game was much closer than that score indicated. Nunavut pushed back hard and brought the score to 6-5 with just over a couple of minutes left to play in the game. Northwest Territories managed to hang on and stay undefeated at 4-0, while Nunavut dropped to 3-1. — *STEPHEN HARRIS, 2023 Ulu News*

Ministerial support for Team Greenland

Greenland's Minister for Sport Peter Olsen is in the region supporting the Wood Buffalo 2023 Arctic Winter Games but is also a competitive athlete himself.

The Minister flew with the Team Greenland charter but has continued his own training for the Greenlandic Championships in March, where he will be competing in cross-country skiing.

"The last few days we've had our own training, it's too cold to train outside today" explained, Peter Olsen, Greenland's minister of education, culture, sports and church, in reference to the extreme cold currently in the Wood Buffalo region.

Speaking about his experience at the 2023 Games, Olsen tells *Ulu News* it's been amazing.

"This isn't my first Winter Games but it's my first as a Minister. We want to support all our Greenlandic athletes. I'm interested to see everything, especially Arctic games, Inuit games and Dene games.

"It's important for athletes to have these Games, especially for our youth because of the opportunity to compete but also to make connections, friendships and experiences."

Greenland has been participating in the Arctic Winter Games since 1990.

In 2002, Greenland hosted the Games for the first time in Nuuk, and they last hosted the Games in 2016. Greenland is the most northerly of the jurisdictions involved in the Arctic Winter Games. — **2023 Ulu News**

A new Arctic Winter Games short track speed skating record was set Tuesday at the Fort McKay Arena. Sage Acorn from the Northwest Territories Team skated a time of 45.02 in the Junior Male 500M competition. Seventeen-year-old Sage, a member of the Yellowknife Speed Skating Club, broke the previous record, set in 2004, by an impressive .35 seconds. — **2023 Ulu News**

What is your favourite meal that your mom makes?



Eggs with white bread.



2023 Games Preparations: The team has been preparing for these Games for a long time and it takes a lot of support to mobilize all the athletes and support staff.


